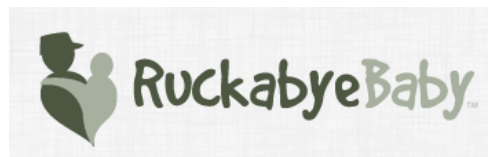
BABYWEARING TO THRIVE

Mission: *To increase maternal and infant health equities in the urban core*

Vision: *For every mother, a healthy baby; For every baby, a healthy village*

What we are about: **Uzazi Village has been established to decrease the maternal and infant health disparities found in the urban core, particularly among African-American women, but also other at-risk populations residing there.**

We accept funds and in-kind donations for slings, wraps, and carriers.

We hold Babywearing Fashion Shows quarterly that are free and open to the public. Attendees will be shown an assortment of carriers, can try them on, and all attendees who would like a carrier will leave with a *free* carrier.

With a referral from a social service agency or safety net clinic a free carrier will be provided with education on how to use it.

If a carrier is not working out for the wearer or child, or the child has outgrown it, it may be exchanged for a different/larger carrier as long as the original is in good working order and is not damaged or stained.
